## **Knowledge Management in Irrigated Cotton and Grains**

#### **Pale Cotton Stainers**

Cotton stainers are recognised as occasional pests of cotton in Australia. Economic damage is unusual because of their;

- incidental control when using broad spectrum insecticides for other pests;
- inability to survive; temperatures above 40°C.
- need for free water to be present.

However in mild seasons Bollgard II® crops maybe a favourable environment for cotton stainers and they may need to be managed.

A new fact sheet on pale cotton stainers has been produced by the Cotton CRC outlining their lifecycle, identification, monitoring, damage, thresholds and management options.
